<b>Eligible Expenditures</b>	Counties may use the funds for the following eligible expenditures (incurred during the period from March 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Offsetting cost of direct county response, planning, and outreach efforts.</li> <li>• Purchase of PPE in response to pandemic.</li> <li>• Administration of the grant by the county of no more than 2% of funds received or \$200,000, whichever is less.</li> <li>• Assistance to the county’s municipalities for response and planning efforts</li> <li>• Allocations to small business grant programs for businesses with fewer than 100 employees and that did not receive funding through the Federal Paycheck Protection Program or the Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program.</li> <li>• Allocations to tourism businesses of all sizes, including state and county fairs.</li> <li>• Grant programs to support costs of assisting businesses during COVID – CEDOs, LDDs, IRCs, SBDCs, and EDCs.</li> <li>• Behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment services.</li> <li>• Broadband deployment with priority to unserved or underserved areas.</li> <li>• Nonprofit assistance programs for 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(19) organizations.</li> </ul>	Eligible Costs include the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Grants to Main Street Businesses and Historically Disadvantaged Businesses to cover operating expenses for the duration of the shutdown and the transition period to re-opening. <i>**This program is separate from the DCED Keystone Communities Program and can fund businesses outside of a designated Main Street community</i></li> <li>• Technical assistance, including training and guidance, for business owners as they stabilize and relaunch their businesses.</li> <li>• Debt payment relief for CDFIs Pennsylvania borrower and loan loss reserves for CDFIs.</li> </ul>	Projects must meet one of the CDBG objectives for Adams County residents <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Benefits low to moderate income person</li> <li>• Removes slums or blight</li> <li>• Meets an urgent community need, usually disaster related</li> <li>• Benefits specific populations, including the elderly, persons with disabilities, abused children, battered spouse, homeless persons, illiterate adults, persons living with HIV/AIDS, or migrant farm workers</li> </ul>	CARES RRP funds may be used to assist eligible households with up to six months of rent incurred between March 1, 2020 and December 30, 2020. CARES RRP may be used to assist lessee households with incomes up to the area median income. Counties must verify that lessee’s unemployment occurred between March 1, 2020 and November 30, 2020 with the Department of Labor and Industry’s Bureau of Unemployment Compensation.	Payroll and inventory, pay debt or fund other expenses. EIDL Advance will provide up to \$10,000, or \$1,000 per employee.	Payroll costs, interest on mortgages, rent, and utilities.
<b>Additional Information</b>	Reminder – these are federal funds, therefore federal funding reporting will be required.	Grant awards may not exceed \$50,000.	Activities responding to COVID-19 will receive priority consideration.	Monthly reports required.	Applications are processed on a first-come, first-serve basis.	Program has limited funds and is highly competitive.
